The Walnut family (Juglandaceae)

Basic Description: This deciduous tree has alternate compound leaves with seven to eleven leaflets. The terminal buds of this tree are bright yellow.

Interesting Facts: It is the most rapid growing of the hickories. The nut meat is so bitter that it is not preferred by wildlife.

Flower: The male flowers are small green catkins and the female flowers are solitary short spikes. They are both found on the same plant.

Fruit: The nut is 1- 1.25" long, oblong to round in shape with a thin shell.

Wildlife Value: It serves as a host for some striking moths such as the Luna and Regal moths and attracts squirrels, rabbits, beavers and small rodents.

Habitat: Found in low wet woods and along streams in the hill sections.
